Proposed Zoning Text Amendment to Permit Placing Conditions on Zoning or Rezoning

Date: Monday, February 7, 2000 Place: M^cCathran Hall Council Room Time: 7:30 p.m.

The Town Council will take public comment regarding a proposal initiated by the Town's Planning Commission to amend <u>Section 13 of the Washington Grove Zoning Ordinance</u> to afford the Town Council, upon the zoning or rezoning of property, the opportunity to adopt such additional restrictions, conditions or limitations deemed appropriate to preserve, improve or protect the general character of the Town. For example, this ordinance would permit the Town to require visual variety in a new housing development as a condition of zoning or rezoning. Building Permits

If you are going to erect a building or structure (including fences), make structural alterations to, or move any existing building or other structure, you must first obtain a building permit from the Washington Grove Planning Commission. The Town zoning ordinance governs setbacks, lot coverage, and height. Applications are available at the Town Office at 301-926-2256. Please allow at least 10 days for review by the Commission. Call John M^cClelland at 301-963-3328 if you have questions about zoning code requirements. Interior renovations which involve electrical, plumbing, or load-bearing changes generally require a County permit. All applications for County-required building permits must **first** be signed off by the Town.
