In response to a resident petition, designated a group to look into options for new streetlights on upper Ridge Rd. Separately, authorized Jim Fletcher to propose specifics a new street light on Maple Ave between Brown and Railroad.

Opened bids for trash and recycling contracts, which will be awarded in April.

Humpback Bridge Replacement

John Compton and Darrell Anderson attended the first working session of the Deer Park Bridge Facilities Planning Study, which the County has funded to study options for replacing the current bridge. Minutes are available in the Town Office.

Casey Field

The proposed alignment of the Amity-Crabbs Branch Rd came under scrutiny of the Wetlands Committee on March 17th. Approval is needed before the 162 unit Preliminary Development Plan is considered by the Planning Board. Stay tuned!

The Mayor sent a letter to County officials (the Planning Board, School Board, County Council) urging that they act now to plan how to keep present schools from further over-crowding before current and proposed residential growth in the Shady Grove Master Plan area constricts the available options. The projected need has already led MCPS to seek reservation of an additional elementary school site.

Building Permits:

If you are going to erect a building or structure (including fences), make structural alterations to, or move any existing building or other structure, you must first obtain a building permit from the Washington Grove Planning Commission. The Town zoning ordinance governs setbacks, lot coverage and height. Applications are available at the Town Office at 301-926-2256. The permit fee is \$10.00, payable to the Town of Washington Grove. Interior renovations, which involve electrical, plumbing, or load-bearing changes, generally require a County permit. The Town must first sign off all applications for County- required building permits. The Historic Preservation Commission will review most permits as well.

back two weeks. Our spring collection will take place between April 1 and the 15th, weather permitting. Please remember that brush and limbs will foul the vacuum. Rake or blow leaves into windrows within six feet of any walkway or roadway, excluding Railroad St., 2nd Ave. and Boundary Street. Large piles appreciated!
