Casey Field:

The Shady Grove Master Plan is now being examined by the PHED Committee. This group will be looking at the possibility of using the Legacy Open Space field for an elementary school site. Although your letter writing efforts convinced the Planning Board to leave the field alone, the County Council can still override that decision. It looks like another Town effort to save the field may be in order. It's almost certain that residents will be asked to write more letters. Stay tuned...

Deer Park Bridge: A higher/wider/relocated Hump-Back Bridge? The County has undertaken a serious study of concepts that will dramatically affect the Grove: all center on rebuilding the Hump-Back Bridge, making it wider for more and faster traffic flow, and higher for greater vertical clearance of trains. Concepts also include widening and realigning Oakmont Avenue to promote moving traffic. The County has scheduled a public "workshop" in Gaithersburg on Monday, January 31st at 7:30 p.m. to solicit reactions of the public to the various concepts. There will be a very important January 27th meeting in the Town Hall at 7:30 p.m.. This meeting will be the Town's opportunity to prepare for the January 31st workshop. It is critical that each of us know as much as possible about the pros and cons of the concepts so that we can talk knowledgeably and effectively with County reps at the workshop. Please come and bring your neighbors to listen and learn.

Water Main Replacement Update

main replacement projects on 4th Avenue and on Brown Street. These projects have grown a bit and now include water mains on Pine Avenue, Cherry Avenue, Grove Avenue, Maple Avenue, and Ridge Road. Replacement of these water mains is scheduled to begin in early spring of this year and should be completed in the fall 2005. You are invited to attend a public meeting where the plans for these replacements can be reviewed. The meeting will provide you with the opportunity to comment on the projects, ask questions, and to review the potential impacts of this construction.

Changes in Building Permit Process

All building permit applications must now be approved or denied by the Planning Commission as a Commission. Residents will continue to deliver the required documentation to the Town Office for initial log-in and dissemination to the Planning and Historic Preservation Commissions. A Planning Commission member will be responsible for reviewing the submitted documents and, if necessary, requesting additional information. Applications will be approved or denied at the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meetings. The Planning Commission meets on the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Room. Residents are urged to plan accordingly. For additional clarification, you may pick up a Permit Process Form and a Flow Chart at the Town Office. Web-posting will happen shortly.

Building Permits:

If you are going to erect a building or structure (including fences), make structural alterations to, or move any existing building or other structure, you must first obtain a building permit from the Washington Grove Planning Commission. The Town zoning ordinance governs setbacks, lot coverage and height. Applications are available at the Town Office at 301-926-2256. The permit fee is \$10.00, payable to the Town of Washington Grove. Interior renovations, which involve electrical, plumbing, or load-bearing changes, generally require a County permit. A shed requires a County permit as well. The Town must first sign off all applications for County-required building permits. The Historic Preservation Commission will review most permits as well.
