Actions at the February 13, 2023 Town Council Meeting

- Approved distribution of the RFP for Landscaping and Maintenance services from April 1, 2023 through June 30, 2025.
- Appointed Mayor John Compton to the Montgomery Municipal Cable Board of Directors.
- Re-appointed all members of the Board of Supervisors of Elections to serve through February 2025.
- Appointed Jonathan Dail as a regular member of the Planning Commission.
- Appointed Councilor Dave Cosson as Interim Mayor Pro-Tempore while both Mayor John Compton and Mayor Pro-Tempore Barbara Raimondo are out of County March 9th – 25th.

Elections News

We are dependent on citizen volunteers to govern. On Saturday, May 13, we will elect a mayor to a one-year term, two Councilors to three-year terms, and one Councilor to a two-year term. There is no more essential volunteer opportunity. The work is rewarding, collegial, and an excellent way to get to know the town and its workings while making a significant contribution. Please consider running or nominating a willing and worthy neighbor.

Nominations are made in writing and close April 10. They require the signatures of two residents as nominators as well as a signature of acceptance from the nominee. They can be submitted to the Board of Election Supervisors directly or given to Kathy in the Town Office. Nominations for Council must indicate whether they are for the two-year term or one of the three-year terms. Candidates for Mayor must have resided in Town for two years immediately preceding the election. Candidates for Council must have resided in Town for one year immediately preceding the election. A qualified voter is defined as anyone registered to vote in Montgomery County at a Washington Grove address.

Maryland State Income Tax

Washington Grove Subdivision Code: 1612

Every year the Town of Washington Grove receives a portion of the Maryland State income tax paid by Town residents. Because most residents do not have mail delivered to street addresses, this presents a challenge for the State Comptroller's office when attributing the taxes collected to Washington Grove. It is **critical** that **all** Washington Grove residents (including renters) designate "**1612**" and "**Washington Grove**" on the tax form. For those filing electronically or using software, there should be a drop-down menu to select Washington Grove. Please share this information with your renters and your tax preparer if appropriate. This **DOES NOT** increase your taxes but **DOES** help ensure the Town receives its proper share of income tax revenue. Thanks for your help! Questions? Call Treasurer Jean Moyer at 301-775-1168.



Budget Work Session

The Town Council Budget Work Session for FY 2024 will take place on Wednesday, March 29, 2023, 7:30 pm via ZOOM. The Mayor and Council will hold a work session to plan a budget for the coming year, which begins on July 1, 2023. Public input is welcomed.

At their April 10 meeting, the Council will adopt a recommended budget to present to the Annual Town Meeting. A summary of the proposed budget will be published in the May Town Bulletin and copies of the budget detail will be available. The Town will adopt a tax rate and budget at the Annual Town Meeting on Saturday, May 13.

Looking for Lifeguards and Lake Guards for Summer 2023

Lifeguards are needed for Maple Lake this summer. Hours are from 12-6pm, seven days a week (including ½ hour break). Lifeguard pay is \$17/hour. Lifeguards must be certified in lifesaving, CPR, and first aid (we can help pay for the training). Lake guards are also needed, and hours are the same as for lifeguards. Geese at Maple Lake

We use the Humane Society's protocol to humanely prevent eggs from hatching in the spring. A pair of geese has nested in an area easily accessible to our egg-oiling team in past years. They drive away the other geese during nesting season and then leave when their eggs do not hatch. Please do not feed or harass the nesting pair or disturb the nest. If you see a nest built, please call John Hutchinson. We encourage visitors to the lake to take along a plastic bag and scoop droppings. THANKS!

The Lighting Committee is working with other Maryland municipalities to work out a process to allow the option of municipal streetlight ownership.

Mayor John Compton and many others testified in support of [Maryland Assembly HB 459](#), enabling legislation for municipal streetlight ownership.

Municipalities around the U.S.A. that have switched to street light ownership have saved money and improved service.

Cities and towns are motivated to save energy while utilities derive their income by selling electricity, so the motivation is different.

HB459 is enabling legislation that clarifies the process for municipalities and counties to acquire utility-owned street lights and establishes fair rules for valuing lights.

HB459 is also supported by the climate change and sustainability communities in Maryland.

Sustainability Investments in Town: WG United Methodist Church Installs Heat Pumps

The Washington Grove United Methodist Church has made a commitment to be better stewards of the environment. The church has taken a huge step toward sustainability by removing its oil burning furnaces and oil storage tank and installing two high efficiency heat pumps to heat and cool the church.

Much more is underway. The church is assembling a track record of its electrical usage to determine the viability of using solar panels on the church's south facing roof. Also, the church is beginning to replace its old flat roof with a new TPO roof (thermoplastic polyolefin made primarily from recycled rubber) that will reflect light and be more energy efficient going forward.

Keep an eye out for the rain barrel that's going in alongside of the church nearest Chestnut Avenue. The water will sustain the flower bed on that side of the building.

And talks are underway with advisors about the possibility of the church serving as a Sustainability Hub for the community. A Sustainability Hub is a location that improves resiliency for a community in times of extreme weather by providing a safe place to shelter with back-up heat, cooling and power.

The WG Sustainability Committee commends the church for these important investments and thanks everyone involved in developing the many modifications that are enhancing the sustainability of the United Methodist Church and our town.

Stormwater Management RFP

On February 13, the Town Council opened three bids for proposals concerning stormwater management in the sections of Town west of Grove Avenue and in the West Woods. These proposals address damage due to the volume and velocity of water. Woods Committee members

are preparing a comparison of the three bids so that the Town Council can make a decision within the next 60 days.

Bridge Replacement

The Woods Committee had the damaged bridge replaced that crosses the creek along the Cherry and Dogwood Trails in the East Woods. Thanks go to the RJ Landscaping team for their help with this project.

Woods Preservation

This time of year, the woods can be very wet, and the weather can be very windy. Please use caution when entering the woods, especially on windy days. A reminder to please stay on the walking trails to protect understory native plant vegetation. Do not walk or bike on trails that are too wet and muddy to avoid rutting, soil erosion. We hope these precautions allow you to experience our woods preserves in a safer and more enjoyable way.

If you discover fallen trees blocking trails, please contact Joan Mahaffey or Patty Klein, Woods Committee Co-chairs. There is currently a large tree blocking the Poplar Trail in the West Woods near the intersection with the Whetstone Trail and Kelley Park. We are working to have this downed tree cut and the trail cleared soon. We appreciate your patience.

We need volunteers to help us protect trees especially in the East Woods. Six newly planted American holly trees have been severely over browsed by deer over the winter. We would like to protect them with stakes and American fencing. If you have good upper body strength and can help us, please contact Joan or Patty.

As we make progress on control of non-native invasive plants and deer over browsing, we anticipate the return of more native ephemerals, shrubs, and saplings, especially in the East Woods. The spring emergence changes from day to day. For help in identifying your discoveries, websites such as the [Chesapeake Bay Native Plant Center's](#) provide descriptions and photographs of native grasses and ground covers, shrubs, and trees. Search within the Piedmont Region for optimal results. Stay healthy and stay happy!

Recyclable Yard Waste Pick-Up Returns

Recyclable yard waste pick-up by our refuse collection company resumes on Thursday, March 2, 2023. Our trash contractor will pick up recyclable yard waste from your properly marked containers and/or large brown bags. You may also bundle your brush and tie it with twine. Bundles should be no larger than 30" in diameter and four feet in length. No individual pieces larger than four inches in diameter. Please keep in mind your container is being picked up by a human being and should not be too heavy.
