The deadline to submit a building permit application for approval by the Planning Commission and review by the Historic Preservation Commission is **the 2nd Wednesday of the month** prior to the PC meeting at which the permit will be reviewed (this will be in the following month). This



timing ensures the HPC will be able to complete a formal review before the PC meeting as this review is required for the PC to approve the permit in a timely fashion. Summer Heat Safety Guidance

During extremely hot and humid weather, it is important to know the symptoms of excessive heat exposure and the appropriate responses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provides a list of warning signs and symptoms of heat illness, and recommended first aid steps. <u>View more information on all of these heat related illnesses</u>

Sustainability Incentives Pilot Program Proposed for Grove Residents

To intensify our efforts to reduce the Grove's GHG emissions, the SC has drafted a program to incentivize our town's conversion from fossil fuels to renewable electricity that augments the evolving federal and state incentives. The incentives will target conversion from fossil fuel heating to electric heat pumps, electric back up, and electric vehicles as long as the household uses renewable power. Conversion from Pepco-generated power to renewable power alone can save 20% of our emissions. Widespread conversions could reduce our emissions by two-

thirds. Watch for news about the forthcoming Sustainability Incentives Pilot Program for Washington Grove.

The Grove Applies for Certification in Sustainable Maryland

Washington Grove joined the Sustainable Maryland organization in 2022. This organization comprises 88 municipalities (out of 163) and is part of a larger Sustainable States Network of 14 states that has influence over 66 million people in 2,524 municipalities. The overall goal of the network is to help the Nation attain a more carbon neutral environment as defined by the Paris Climate Accords. Washington Grove has applied for Bronze Certification to gain access to the knowledge base and influence of the state and national organizations. Our application details many Sustainable Actions by the Town, each of which earns points towards certification. Actions include promotion of composting and gas-free yard equipment, establishing the community garden, education and outreach efforts, watershed stewardship, earning recognition as a Tree City, installing electric vehicle chargers, and several more. The Green Team portion of the Sustainability Committee has submitted the application to Sustainable Maryland for review. Certification Awards will be announced in October.

Slots Available to Join Community Solar Farm

Kevin Cheung and Crystal Robinson from Utility Advisor attended the ribbon cutting celebration on June 10th for the town's new electric vehicle chargers and answered questions about enrolling in the community solar program that supports solar electricity generation. Community solar offers a guaranteed savings of up to 10%, and much higher savings for those who qualify as low- or moderate-income households. If your household income is in the range of \$70,000 -\$105,000, Kevin advises applying for the 25% discount. Many residents in Washington Grove are already enrolled. In the past, there was a long wait time to enroll but slots are currently available. Town Council Approves Switching Town Electricity Accounts to Solar Generation

On June 12, the Town Council agreed to sign the town's three qualified municipal accounts (for electric power at McCathran Hall, the maintenance building, and the lake) to community solar with Skyview Solar Energy. Activation is expected starting this fall.

Town's 2021 Inventory of Greenhouse Gas Emissions Completed

The Sustainability Committee (SC) has completed an inventory of the major contributors to our town's greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. The major factors are electrical generation (Pepco's sources for our power); cars (mostly internal combustion); and heating (mostly oil and gas furnaces). An alarming fact is that the average Grove house emits 76% more GHG than the average county house. Clearly, we have a bigger challenge than our neighbors and need to be more ambitious. Two More Heat Pumps Installed in Washington Grove

Two more homes in town recently converted from fossil fuels to heat pumps to heat and cool their homes:

- Kirk Greenway reports that, utility wise, his home is now decarbonized, with solar offset on electricity, a hybrid hot water heat pump, and a heat pump for heating and cooling the house, as well as an electric vehicle. Next, he'll be looking into upgrading home insulation.
- The Rivard household immediately converted their oil furnace upon moving in, as they did not want to live in a house with what they considered a dirty energy source.

Comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan

In the next few weeks, Soltesz Engineering is scheduled to submit their design plan for Storm Water Management in the residential portion of Town, west of Grove Avenue, and in the West Woods. Our next steps will be to examine the design plan, when submitted, and decide on priority areas for construction. This will be done in collaboration with the Mayor and Town Council.

Whetstone Spring Restoration

Construction has begun on the restoration of Whetstone Spring in the West Woods. An historic 1961 photograph is the model for the restoration which should be completed in time for the 150th Anniversary Celebration the weekend of August 12 and 13.

Control of Non-Native Invasive Plants

Work continues in the East and West Woods during June and July to control NNI plants, such as wisteria, mile-a-minute and wavy leaf basket grass. Signs will be posted near work areas. A blue dye is used and visible whenever there is target spraying.

Woods Trails

We are installing additional trail name signs at walking trail intersections in the East and West Woods to orient hikers. These trail signs were erected to keep people safe and enjoy our forest preserves. If you find any fallen trees across trails, dumping of plant debris, or any safety issues in our Forest Preserves, please contact Wood Committee co-chairs Joan Mahaffey or Patty Klein.

Please stay on the walking trails to protect these reforestation areas. Enjoy all seasons in our forest preserves!
