Joint Emory Grove - Washington Grove United Methodist Churches Resolution

At their joint service at the Washington Grove Methodist Church on Sunday, August 13, the two Methodist churches presented the Town with "A Resolution Acknowledging Methodism's

Racially Exclusionary Past and Committing to an Equitable and Inclusive Future". The Resolution was accepted by Councilor Barbara Raimondo. She noted how appropriate it is on this day of 2023 that the Town is celebrating the 150-year anniversary of the first Washington Grove Methodist camp meeting – that now both the Town, and the Methodist churches of Washington Grove and Emory Grove, have acknowledged our racially exclusionary past in Resolutions that set standards for an inclusive future.

Attention All Residents

What do you think of allowing Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) in Washington Grove? The Planning Commission will be discussing possible changes to our ordinances which would allow a resident to add one such unit to their property. Before we send our wording to the Town Council, we would like to get public input on what we are proposing. Your opinions are important and will influence the ordinance language we submit to the Council. More specific information on ADUs and the current draft ordinance will be sent out by September 8 in a Grove Alert. Thanks in advance for adding your input to this process.

Building Permit Submission Deadline

The deadline to submit a building permit application for approval by the Planning Commission and review by the Historic Preservation Commission is **the 2nd Wednesday of the month** prior to the PC meeting at which the permit will be reviewed (this will be in the following month). This timing ensures the HPC will be able to complete a formal review before the PC meeting as this review is required for the PC to approve the permit in a timely fashion. If you are considering any renovation or building project at your house, be sure to get a copy of the procedures to apply for a Town Building Permit which will help you through the Town's process.

Town Council Approves Renewable Energy Incentive Program for Grove Residents

The Town Council unanimously approved setting up the pilot incentive program recommended by the Sustainable Committee (SC) that was outlined at the Annual Town Meeting in May. The SC adjusted the proposed program by incorporating comments from many sources and presented it at the August Council Meeting. The program will provide cash incentives for converting from fossil fuel heating to heat pumps, upgrading old heat pumps or replacing backup fossil fuel heating with electric backup, and/or replacing fossil fuel vehicles with electric-powered ones. EV purchases and heating system conversions to renewable energy fuels made as of July 1, 2023, will be eligible on a first-come, first-served basis. These cash incentives will augment the federal and state incentives and can work with the state historic district tax credits that most of the houses in the Grove are eligible for. The SC will provide guidance in the preparation of the documents for the various incentives.

Edible Garden Update: A Great First Year

The community garden inside the tennis court area is having a great year. By the numbers:

- Over 400 pounds of vegetables have been donated to the food bank (Manna, So What Else, and St. Martin's) in 2023, plus about 60 pounds in late 2022.
- Fifteen types of produce have been donated (sweet potato leaves, sweet potatoes, lettuce, spinach, kale, collards, mustard greens, peas, garlic, potatoes, tomatoes, onions, peppers, winter squash, and beans)
- About 25 Grovers have volunteered at the garden at least once.
- The garden has been a subject of three presentations: to the MoCo Food Council, the Religious Land Use Working Group, and the Gaithersburg-Washington Grove Garden Club. It also appears in a <u>video clip on MCC</u> and was open for a tour last month during the 150th anniversary celebration weekend.
- The garden cost about \$600 in the first year, drawn from the sponsoring Sustainability Committee's budget. The committee has recently voted to continue sponsorship. Our donations are now also being logged with the non-profit HarvestShare, and we are exploring grant opportunities with that organization.

With every delivery of produce to a distribution site, we see firsthand the food insecurity in Montgomery County. St. Martin's for example, helps feed 300 families each week. The food bank is very appreciative of donations of fresh produce to complement the shelf stable foods that they typically receive.

The native plant pollinator garden has been an attractive addition this year. To help with the gnat problem over these recent rainy weeks, we have hung hummingbird feeders from the shed. One hummingbird can eat 1000 gnats per day!

We are currently making plans to plant winter cover crops, garlic and more. The garden crew always welcomes new volunteers. As an added perk of volunteering, the gardeners get to take home the imperfect but still delicious & nutritious food that cannot be donated.

Maryland State Incentives: Electric Vehicle Tax Credit...and More

If you purchase and title an electric vehicle or fuel cell electric vehicle (powered by hydrogen) between July 1, 2023, and July 1, 2027, you may be eligible to claim an excise tax credit up to \$3,000 from the State of Maryland. <u>View the details here</u>. Scroll down on this site for other valuable information, such as a rebate on the cost of acquiring and installing a qualified electric vehicle charger and obtaining a permit from the Maryland Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MDOT MVA) to use the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes, regardless of the number of passengers in the vehicle.

Deer Management

The Town Council has approved continuation of the deer management program in the East and West Woods with our volunteer Bow Hunter Fire Fighters of Maryland (BHFFMD) this Fall-Winter season. The season runs from Friday, September 8, 2023, until Wednesday, January 31, 2024. A deer management program will also occur in the meadows to the east of Town, under the auspices of Montgomery County Parks. The BHFFMD are skilled archers. They will be hunting at sunrise and sunset. Signs will be posted at the entrances to the Woods. There is no danger to hikers using the forest trails at any time during this hunting season. The East and West Woods will be open during this archery season. Please keep dogs on a leash. Contact Joan Mahaffey or Patty Klein, Woods Committee Co-chairs, if you have questions.

Stormwater Management

Jason Mills of Soltesz and his associates have submitted their assessment of our current level of stormwater infrastructure. The report includes short-, medium-, and long-term

recommendations for the Town and residents extending west from Grove Road to Washington Grove Lane, and into the West Woods. WC members will work with the Mayor and Town Council to prioritize projects and develop an RFP for "design to build" construction.

Stiltgrass

Woods Committee volunteers Dave Cosson and Joan Mahaffey have trimmed stiltgrass along trails in the East Woods to make the trails more passable and to help avoid tick exposure. Whetstone Spring in the West Woods has been beautifully restored by Steve Werts and our Town landscapers, RJ Landscaping. We encourage you to visit this peaceful, breathtaking site along the Whetstone Trail just before you reach Kelley Park. Stay healthy and safe and enjoy the beauty of nature in our East and West Woods Preserves.



Polls of homeless people consistently show that if they have a choice of food or socks, they will always choose socks because they might be able to find food other places, but winter without socks is unbearable.

Help Fill the Teacher's Closet at Washington Grove Elementary

While many of us donated backpacks and schools supplies to kids starting back to school, the need doesn't stop there. Paper, pencils, pens, erasers, glue sticks and other school supplies are needed through the year, and all too often, teachers end up paying for these things out of their own pockets. The Woman's Club tries to keep the Teacher's Closet filled with these essentials for children's learning. Please consider continuing to donate these throughout the year.

The Needs are Great

With the increasing number of people becoming homeless every day, the need to help them is also growing. We can't end the poverty and homelessness around us, but our Town, through your generous contributions and donations, goes a long way towards making life a little easier for these people, especially the children.

The Woman's Club maintains a store house of your donations, which we use every month to put together boxes for each of the eight Archways families we support. While we can't feed them every day, we can make sure they have some daily treats. We collect fruit cups, individually wrapped bags of cookies, crackers, and other snacks. Imagine what you enjoy snacking on and donate these for the kids in the Archways program! Also always needed are pasta, pasta sauce, peanut butter and grape jelly.

In addition to food, there's a critical need for non-SNAP necessities, like towels, wash clothes, cleaning supplies, feminine hygiene products and deodorant. Other non-SNAP items that are always needed are diaper wipes, hand sanitizers, laundry detergent, paper towels, any flavor of Pedialyte, blue box Similac powder and toilet paper. With the recent major cuts to the SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) allowances, our monthly boxes of non-SNAP items mean that families don't have to stretch their budgets to buy those needed supplies.

Clothing Partnership with Emory Grove United Methodist

We continue to have a great response to our partnership with Emory Grove Church to collect used clothing, in good condition, to give to people in the community on the third weekend of each month. The Church will pick up and distribute clothes.
