- **9.** Town Council Reports* Of note:
 - a. *Lighting (Raimondo)* Significant progress made with Pepco to establish procedures for municipal purchase of streetlights. LC seeking documentation for the age of town streetlights to use to establish their value.
 - b. *Forestry and Beautification (Raimondo)* –12 trees and two bushes planted.
 - c. *Sustainability (Warfield)* The County Council passed a gas-powered leaf blower ban. It will be phased in, banning sales in July 2024 and use in July 2025. Rebates for equipment replacement may be offered.
 - d. *Woodward Park (Patrone)* Eva met with playground equipment vendors to assess playground status and needs. An ad hoc workgroup is being created to consider how best to spend ~\$30,000 (\$15K town funds and \$15K Program Open Space matching funds).
 - e. *Planning Commission (Nagrod)* An informational meeting on the proposal to permit Accessory Dwelling Units took place at the regular PC meeting October 4th. Several significant questions and suggestions emerged, and the Commission will be considering these during further review of their draft zoning revision proposals.
 - f. *Woods (Dibble)* A project is in progress proposing to restore Maple Spring. Inclusion of the Spring within the Maple Lake fence is being debated.
