The Washington Grove Town Council will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, January 23, 2024, 7:30 pm. The meeting will be online via Zoom videoconference. The purpose of this hearing is to take public comment regarding the proposed Zoning Text Amendment No. 2023 - 08; Ordinance Amending the Washington Grove Zoning Ordinance to Expand Housing Opportunities and Update Vehicle Parking Requirements. Washington Grove Connector Multi-Use Pathway

MCDOT reported on 15% engineering work for two alignments supported by the Town that directly connect Brown Street to the end of Crabbs Branch. The least expensive of the two, with a cost estimate of \$811,000, is the option with the least impact on the environment. At this level, funding earmarked for construction will be required from the County. The Mayor and Liaison Committee will be advocating for its inclusion in the MCDOT 2025 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). We will reach out for support to our neighbors who also will benefit (Gaithersburg, and the Emory Grove and Amity neighborhoods). Learn more here.

The deadline to submit a building permit application for approval by the Planning Commission and review by the Historic Preservation Commission is **the 2**nd **Wednesday of the month** prior to the PC meeting at which the permit will be reviewed (this will be in the following month). This

timing ensures the HPC will be able to complete a formal review before the PC meeting as this review is required for the PC to approve the permit in a timely fashion. If you are considering any renovation or building project at your house, be sure to get a copy of the procedures to apply for a Town Building Permit which will help you through the Town's process.

Woods Committee News

Because of the New Years Holiday, there will be no Woods Committee Meeting in January. Our next meeting will be Monday, February 5, 2024, 7:30 pm via Zoom Video Conference. The Zoom link will be sent in the February Bulletin.

The Woods Committee will be working on several projects in the New Year:

- continue trail maintenance and signage to increase enjoyment for all of the Forest Preserves and to protect newly sprouting trees and understory.
- develop digital maps of trails in the East and West Woods.
- improve stormwater drainage in the West Woods coming from the residential part of Town, from Washington Grove Lane and from the Towne Crest area.
- continue reforestation projects.

If you are interested in working on any of these projects, please contact either Joan Mahaffey or Patty Klein (Woods Committee co-chairs) or join us at our February 5 meeting.

Our volunteer Bow Hunter Fire Fighters of Maryland (BHFFMD) continued their bow hunting in our East and West Woods and the lower meadow. Two does and one buck were harvested in December. Members of BHFFMD are EMTs and firefighters who are vigilant about public safety, and therefore, there is no reason to curtail our use of the Woods. They will bow hunt at sunrise

and sunset. The archery season extends through January 31, 2024. Please contact Joan Mahaffey or Pat Klein if you have any questions.

A reminder to please stay on the walking trails to protect understory native plant vegetation and avoid tick exposure to you and your pets. Do not use trails that are too wet and muddy to avoid soil erosion and damage to your boots. Be careful entering the Woods on windy days, especially after heavy rain. We hope the New Year brings you many opportunities to enjoy the seasonal beauty of our East and West Woods Preserves.
