



## C. Paper that You Can Put Out Roadside (But NOT in the same Blue Bin as your glass, metal and plastic containers)

Flatten all empty boxes; tie in bundles no larger than 3' x 3' and no thicker than 6" each. Acceptable materials can be combined and placed in paper bags or small cardboard boxes.

<b>Mixed Paper</b>	Newspapers Magazines Catalogs Office and computer paper Unwanted mail Envelopes with windows Paperback books Milk and juice cartons with a plastic spout (leave spout as is)	NO packing material (foam/ plastic) NO food-soiled paper such as plastic or wax coated liners, pizza boxes NO wax-coated liners NO wax paper, carbon paper NO paint-contaminated paper NO hardback books NO foil gift wrap or any paper packaging that includes foil/metallic printing or other elements NO paper towels, napkins or tissues
<b>Cardboard</b>	Corrugated cardboard, cereal and all other paper boxes	NO DIRTY PIZZA BOXES NO food-soiled cardboard

## 2. Recycling Plastic Bags at Your Local Grocery Store or at the Transfer Station (See <https://bit.ly/moco-plastics-recycling> for more info about recycling these items at the Transfer Station)

Please recycle only **clean, dry** plastic bags and film. Remove receipts, labels, tape, food residue or any other items from bags.

### Recycle These

Retail, carryout, produce, newspaper, bread, and dry-cleaning bags  
Zip-top food storage bags  
Plastic shipping envelopes, bubble wrap and air pillows (deflate)  
Product wrap on cases of water/soda bottles, paper towels, napkins, disposable cups, bathroom tissue, diapers, and female sanitary products  
Furniture and electronic wrap  
Plastic cereal box liners (**but** if it tears like paper, **do not include**)  
Any film packaging or bag that has the *How2Recycle* Label

### Not Acceptable

NO degradable/compostable bags or film packaging  
NO pre-washed mixed salad bags  
NO frozen food bags  
NO candy bar wrappers  
NO chip bags  
NO six-pack rings  
NO crinkly plastic  
NO rigid plastic
